For Municipal Staff & Council **From Strategy to Reality**

9:00 AM - 12:00 PM **SENIOR LEADERSHIP & COUNCIL: LEADERSHIP LAB**

Infrastructure gaps aren't just a planning issue. They are a political and generational reckoning. In this leadership lab, senior leaders and elected officials will dig into why the funding gap exists, face the hard truths about expectations versus affordability, and practice how to explain tough choices while still earning public trust. Participants will work through real-world cases and build skills to lead through uncertainty without losing sight of political realities. Legacy is not just what you build; it is also what you choose not to.

9:00 AM - 12:00 PM **ENGINEERING, PUBLIC WORKS, OPERATIONS: PRIORITIZING WHAT MATTERS**

Too many assets. Not enough people, time, or money. This hands-on session tackles a hard truth: many municipalities are carrying more infrastructure than they can afford to operate, maintain, or replace. Through real-world examples and discussion, participants will learn how to assess service risks, set priorities, and manage the gap between expectations and available resources. The focus is not on doing more with less, but on doing what you can with purpose, backed by evidence and clear risk-based decisions.

1:00 - 4:00 PM **JOINT SESSION: PULLING IN THE SAME DIRECTION**

After a morning in separate sessions, leadership and operations will come together to tackle the real challenge: delivering services with fewer resources and higher expectations. This session builds real conversations across the staff-council divide, without the pressure of real-time decisions. Mixed-municipality teams will use quick discussions, real-world case studies, and low-stakes role-play to surface hidden risks, unpack assumptions, and start sketching a roadmap for "right-sizing" back home. You will leave with a draft plan to build on, and the confidence to keep tough conversations moving. The only thing worse than a tough decision is making it alone, without the right conversations first. If you're serious about keeping your community strong, you need to be in the room. The real work starts here.
